## **From Father Simon**



*'What is it?'* – these words are the literal meaning of "*manna*" – the daily bread given by God to the Israelites during their forty years of wandering in the wilderness. *Manna* received its name reportedly from the question the Israelites asked when they first saw it, "What is it?" or "*mannu*?". The people were instructed to gather it daily with the exception of the Sabbath. If they gathered too much, the remainder would spoil. Only on the sixth day were they permitted to gather a double portion. It was not until the people of Israel finally arrived in

Canaan and began to eat of the produce of the Promised Land did the *manna* cease to fall.

*Manna* was described as a fine, flake-like frost. It was like a coriander seed, white, and had the taste of a wafer made with honey. *Manna* could be prepared in a variety of ways: ground into a meal, boiled in pots, or made into cakes. *Manna* was the only regular food apart from the occasional quail that the people of Israel had for forty years.

God's providence to the people of Israel through their wandering years reminds us of three things. First, the continued dependence of the people on the God who brought them out of the land of slavery, sustained them with *manna* in the desert and water from the rock and protected them from serpents and other calamities.

Second, it reminds us to not hold on to things for long. The people of Israel had to gather just enough *manna* for the day, except on the day before the Sabbath. Otherwise the *manna* would rot. It is why we pray "give us *this* day our daily bread". Gandhi once said: "the world has enough for everyman's need not for each man's greed".

Third, *manna* is a foreshadowing of the true Bread from Heaven. Each time we gather to share the Bread of Life we acknowledge our dependence on God, express our gratitude for his blessings, and ask for strength to continue our sharing and caring beyond the Eucharistic table.

We must always remember that the God of Israel is the God of Jesus and *our* God.

I thank you for your presence at our Eucharistic table, whether it is every day, on Sundays or whenever you feel the need to be fed. Please know that your presence at the table is a blessing to another.

#### **Back to School**

- Organization Day for QAS students and their parents is scheduled on August 9 from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm in the Holy Name Room. It is aptly named for all the paperwork and forms that are turned in for the coming school year. The much anticipated homeroom lists are also posted on the school blog in the morning. All types of forms from milk orders to special lunches will be collected on that day. If you cannot make it, bins will be available in the school to drop off the forms starting on August 10th from 9:00am until 12:00pm. We are always looking for volunteers to help at school with recess duty, crossing guards, room parents, etc. and those forms will be available as well.
- **Teachers return** on August 15. It is a busy week for teachers as they organize their classrooms and engage in orientation and professional development. This year the teachers will be learning about Responsive Classrooms which is an evidence-based approach to education that focuses on the strong relationship between academic success and social-emotional learning. The Responsive Classroom approach empowers educators to create safe, joyful, and engaging learning communities where all students have a sense of belonging and feel significant.
- School begins on August 21 for students in grades 1-8. Dismissal on the first day is at 11:45 am. Full day classes begin on August 22.
- We are most happy to note the **new windows installed in eight classrooms in the Lemont Building**, thanks to the efforts of Wyndows Installation Corp and financed by funds pledged in the *Raise the Paddle* segment in this year's UPP and matched by the parish. After 73 years the old windows were due for replacement and the new windows will be a big help to the comfort of our students and teachers and will boost our academic mission.

#### **Other Basilica Repair Projects**

- We began repairs of water damage to the **four transept windows**, including replacing the caulk around the storm windows, removal and cleaning of the **stained glass windows**, as well as repairs to the support rods holding the stained glass windows in place. The windows along the side aisles will also require repairs, to be performed in the near future.
- We have now completed work on replacing the **ceiling above the choir loft**. This required a special scaffolding as well as the disassembling of the organ itself. The organ has been reassembled and we can again appreciate the full capability of this magnificent part of our music ministry. Please see <u>Music Director Ken Sotak's letter in this past</u> <u>bulletin</u> for a vivid description of the work necessary to protect the organ, loft and balcony during the ceiling project.
- Thanks to the efforts of our UPP event at the Raise the Paddle, we replaced windows in eight classrooms in the Lemont building and the washrooms! After 73 years those windows are well past their useful life and our students in the School and Religious Education programs will again benefit from the generosity of our parishioners.
- Significant work on the **bell tower** will begin later this year, and scaffolding will be erected inside the bell tower this year and outside the Basilica early next year.
- The deteriorated **marble behind the side altars** has been removed and will be replaced with a modern lightweight replacement material similar to what was used in the sanctuary behind the main altar a few years ago. Currently there is a temporary substitute in place.
- The drainpipes along the Basilica are being removed to allow the stone behind to be tuckpointed.
- At the **Keene Building** we will be tuckpointing at the north end, including at the stairway at the northeast side of the building (see photo).

#### Update on Our Capital Campaign

Our attention has now turned toward realizing **Phase I of the campaign, the Benedict Center**. As always, our objective has been to achieve a quality renovation of the highly underused former convent space, both for the benefit of our school as well as the benefit of our various adult ministries and other parish groups who need additional room for their vitally important activities, all as part of a highly cost-effective major construction project.

- Work began as soon as school let out, with asbestos removal work for Phase II (Lemont Building) and Phase III (Keene Building). That work is complete so Phase I (Benedict Center) will now begin and continue through the summer of 2019. A fence will be erected around the Benedict Center in early August and construction will begin after Labor Day.
- A word about asbestos. Like nearly all buildings constructed in the 1940s and 1950s, our Keene and Lemont buildings contained asbestos, primarily in the wrapping around hot water pipes and in floor tiles. Up until now we have carefully maintained the safety of our buildings through the normal and commonly accepted process of "encapsulation" and regular inspection of that asbestos. Now, however, the upcoming construction projects in those

buildings scheduled for a year from now required us to actually remove that encapsulated asbestos. That is what we scheduled for early summer 2018 and which has now been completed.

- We will continue to keep our parish fully informed as the project continues, but in the meantime please consider two thoughts. First, please keep current on your pledge, so that we have sufficient cash on hand to make payment on our project as it progresses. Second, please consider whether your circumstances might permit increasing your pledge.
- We are still accepting pledges! If you didn't or were unable to make a pledge before, you can still make one now. Pledge cards are available at all church entrances or you can visit <u>http://www.qasparish.org/component/content/</u> article/44-parish/540-campaign.html and make your pledge online.



## **Ministers of Care** <u>Formation Classes at St. Benedict's</u>





#### **The Sacrament of Baptism**

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year, at 1:30pm. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A Baptismal Preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must also be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

#### **The Sacrament of Matrimony**

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

#### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
