FROM FATHER SIMON



Last Monday, at a ‘virtual staff meeting’ we discussed many areas of parish life and administration including plans for the future that is so much in flux. With almost all of our parish staff working from home, this was a welcome change to connect with everyone and seek ways to better serve the people of our parish in these challenging times.

Our top priority was making plans to celebrate the sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation for our parish children and Graduation for the students of our school. Our plan for First Communion is to wait until the fall when the second-grade students return to school. We will have to adapt how we do this keeping in mind that there may be some protocols we may have to follow post-coronavirus. With regard to Graduation and Confirmation, our Principal, Emily Carlson has had discussions with a few parents and are in the process of finalizing plans to celebrate these milestones in the lives of these young people. It would be ideal to celebrate Confirmation and Graduation together, how-

ever in these circumstances we will do what is best and permitted so that these celebrations will be memorable for the children. We have options for a couple of weekends in June and a couple of weekends in August to celebrate these events and hopefully, we will be able to do so.

On the construction front, we put off completing Phase III of our Capital Campaign Project to next summer. The primary focus of this phase was the completion of the Parish Center and a few other odds and ends. However, we will do the necessary abatement work in preparation for the work next year. We will also finish bringing in more electrical power to air-condition the parish center and for future needs. Finally, we will do the necessary summer maintenance projects in the school and the basilica. The basilica work involves fixing the masonry problems on the west transept windows. The work on west altar is on hold until next year.

I am grateful to all of you for your continued financial support of the parish. Many of you have signed up for electronic giving, most of you continue to mail in or drop off your Sunday offering – Thank You Very Much! In these times, we are increasing our efforts to be prudent stewards of the resources we have been blessed with. Please help us by continuing your financial support of our parish.

Finally, the parish staff has three goals: one, how to enhance the ways we help people connect with God through Word and Worship; two, how to help people connect with one another, and three, how do we as staff continue to strengthen one another during this time. We will continue to record and post weekend Masses and at the same time we are looking into ways to livestream weekend and weekday Masses. We will also post resources on our website and social media to deepen your connection to your faith. Some of you will be receiving calls from our ministers of care and other ministries to find out how you are doing and see if we can help you in anyway. The virtual retreat last Tuesday had about fifty participants. We will continue to explore other channels of this nature. I also encourage you to call on your friends and neighbors for a friendly hello and chat. Be safe and stay healthy.

FIGHTING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS



DV hotline calls have increased. Check on those who may need help during this crisis. Experience and data tell us that financial crises, home confinement and prolonged stress exacerbate the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. It is no surprise that the Covid-19

pandemic has made life more dangerous for many already at risk in our country. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline reports that calls for help have increased 50% in March, from 60 to 90 a day. Some victims were about to leave their abuser, but now the abuser is home all the time, and they have less opportunity to free themselves. Some are in counseling, and now in-person services are unavailable. Some abusers are more angry by loss of work or home quarantine and thus more threatening to their partners.

If you know or suspect someone is a victim, please check on them! If they are in immediate need, help them call 911. Victims, as well as concerned family members, friends or neighbors can call the National DV Hotline at 1-800-799-7233. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline, 877-863-6338 can also be called, as well as any other reputable DV resource to help victims connect with support and services.



A CALL TO CARE FOR CREATION



 - The phone number to give by text is 773-661-4683.
 - To make a Sunday donation send a text with the keyword “*sundayqas*” followed by an amount (e.g., to **make a \$100 donation to Sunday collections, text: *sundayqas 100***). To make an Easter donation text “easter” followed by the amount. Leave a space between the keyword and the amount.
 - If you do not have a GiveCentral account, you may still text the same way to the same number which will then return a link that will allow you to enter your contact and payment information for your donation.
- At this time, donations may only be made to Sunday and Easter using Text to Give.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is celebrated at 1:30pm two or three Sundays of the month, depending on the time of year. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. They are held once a month on alternate Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and must be scheduled in advance. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There are few openings for "Shepherds" in the classified ads today, but few occupations are as dear to the Christian heart. Most of us tenderly place shepherds by our Christmas cribs, name the Twenty-Third Psalm as our favorite, and recognize "Good Shepherd" as a title of Jesus. Bishops carry a staff, called a crozier, modeled after the shepherd's walking staff. Long before Christian artists painted Jesus on the cross, they traced on the walls of their worship places images of a strong young shepherd, shouldering a lost sheep and bringing it to safety. Springtime is the season of lambing, a time when the shepherd not only learns the faces of the new arrivals, but also when the newborn sheep become attuned to the voice of the shepherd. This is exactly what we do as a community in Easter as we shelter and guide the newly received Christians, and also put our Lenten muscles to good use: listening more attentively to God's Word, and responding with springtime vigor to God's call.


